To support the initiative, MCAMW member contractor companies volunteered to instruct various Virtual Career-Prep sessions for CTE seniors in the Prince George's County Public School's (PGCPS) CTE Construction Trades Program. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, these sessions were hosted in person, encompassing the key benefits of hands-on instruction and networking opportunities. Adjusting the platform to abide by safety standards, PGCPS reached out to industry and employer partners for additional support to host a virtual alternative of the career preparation program.

The virtual program strived to ensure that students had the resources and ample opportunities to gain critical career development experience prior to graduation in late spring. Focusing on job interviewing skills, the session topics included:

- Resume Reviews
- Interview Appearance & Language
- Creating an "Elevator Pitch"
- Learning Types of Questions to Expect from Employers & How to Best Answer
- Practice Questions in Mock Interviews with Industry Representatives

The results from the experience were deemed as invaluable by students, faculty members, and employers alike.
